



## PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT Carbon Monoxide Detectors

June 5, 2008

To All Interested Individuals:

Recently, the Florida Legislature passed new statutory requirements for the installation of carbon monoxide detectors/alarms in all new construction. Florida Statute 553.885 and Rule 9B-3.0472 Florida Administrative Code mandates that every building for which a building permit is issued for new construction on or after July 1, 2008 and having a fossil-fuel-burning heater or appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage shall have an approved operational carbon monoxide alarm installed within 10 feet of each room used for sleeping purposes. The carbon monoxide detectors installed as a result of this statute shall be listed or labeled as being in compliance with ANSI/UL 2034-96 or UL 2075-04 and shall receive their primary power from the building wiring when the building wiring is served from the local power utility. A battery back-up power supply is also required. This new mandate is in addition to the requirements already in place for smoke detectors required by the Florida Building Codes.
